FACULTY HIGHLIGHT: SUJATA PATIL

A Midwesterner for most of her life, **Sujata Patil, PhD,** moved to NYC to join MSKCC in the Spring of 2006. At MSKCC, Sujata primarily works with oncologists and surgeons in the breast and genitourinary cancer services on the design and analysis of clinical studies. In a recent publication, Sujata and colleagues showed that, in an MSKCC clinical trial population, disease characteristics used to predict whether a metastatic renal cell cancer patient has poor, intermediate, or favorable prognosis have shifted in distribution over the last three decades. This has an effect on how we design and interpret current renal cancer clinical studies. In January 2010, a paper presenting this work was published in *Cancer*, "<u>Stage</u> migration and <u>increasing</u> proportion of favorable-prognosis

metastatic renal cell carcinoma patients," by Sujata Patil, Nicole Ishill, John Deluca, and Robert J. Motzer. The team is currently validating this observation in a large multicenter, international study including more than 3,700 patients.

Sujata received her PhD in Biostatistics from the University of Michigan with a dissertation study on methods to investigate the relationship between two or more longitudinal trajectories as predictors of disease outcome. During her studies, Sujata also reveled in Russian language and literature studies. Russian novels such as The Brothers Karamazov by Dostoyevsky and The Master and Margarita by Mikhail Bulgakov are two of her favorites.

CRG CORNER

The Clinical Research Database (CRDB) runs on three platforms including CRDB Client, CRDB Web and CRDBi. The Computer Resource Group (CRG) introduced new forms, reports, and additional data collection tools including:

Pharmacokinetics Form

CRDBi is the web client platform of the Clinical Research Database. The release version is currently CRDBi 1.22.1 American Congress of Epidemiology. Twenty five epidemiologic societies and over 100 Congress Faculty are involved in sponsoring and planning this event. Participants will include epidemiologic researchers, methodologists, educators, and policy makers from academia, public health, government, and industry. Over 30 symposia and 14 workshops are scheduled. Hundreds of abstracts will be also chosen from almost 1300 submissions to be presented in the 32 contributed paper and three poster sessions. This is the most significant meeting in the field and is held only once every five years.

The Congress will recognize notable contributions to epidemiology study, practice and policy through eight awards in three categories: distinguished scientists, student paper prizes, and training program excellence. These awards are named in honor of epidemiologists who have advanced our field in years past. The submission deadline for the Scientist and Training Program awards is March 1, 2011.
