RESEARCH FUNDING SUCCESS

Jen Brooks, PhD, was awarded the Chanel Endowment to Fund Survivorship Research for her proposal, "CYP2D6 Phenotype, Tamoxifen Treatment and Risk of Contralateral Breast Cancer in the Women's Environment Cancer and Radiation Epidemiology (WECARE) Study Population." Tamoxifen has been associated with a reduced risk of second primary contra-

lateral breast cancer (CBC). CYP2D6 is a central enzyme in the metabolism of tamoxifen and patients with genetic variants in this gene may not experience the full protective effect of tamoxifen with respect to risk of CBC. This study will investigate how genetic variation in CYP2D6 and the corresponding CYP2D6 phenotype, impact the relationship between tamoxifen and risk of CBC. This work is being done in collaboration with Jonine Bernstein (PI of the WECARE Study) and Irene Orlow.



Jen was also awarded a Goldstein award for her study "Tumor effects on the measurement of enhancement on breast MRI: Implications for study design." The objective of this study is to determine if the degree to which normal breast tissue enhances during contrast-enhanced breast MRI (back-

ground parenchymal enhancement (BPE)) is influenced by the presence of a tumor in the contralateral breast when measured at the time of cancer diagnosis. This project has important implications for multiple ongoing studies of BPE and is done in collaboration with <u>Jonine Bernstein</u> and <u>Malcolm Pike</u>, as well as investigators in the Department of Radiology; Janice Sung and Elizabeth Morris.

Elena Elkin, PhD, received a Goldstein award for her proposal, "Patient-Centered Decision Support for Lung Cancer Screening." The goal of this study is to develop a patient-centered, web-based decision aid for lung cancer screening in current and former smokers and to assess its usability. The decision aid will include individualized assessments of lung cancer risk and mortality and the benefits and harms of screening.

NYC EPIDEMIOLOGY FORUM

The New York City Epidemiology Forum (NYCEF) was recently created to provide a forum for regular contacts and exchanges among epidemiologists working in New York City. The overall goal is to provide opportunities for collaborations and career opportunities, particularly for junior investigators. The NYCEF will hold its first annual conference at the Icahn School of Medicine at Mount Sinai on February 28, 2014, from 9am-4:30pm. Muin Khoury, MD, PhD, from NCI's Epidemiology and Genomics Research Program, will be the keynote speaker. There will be 12 short talks on ongoing work in different areas, chosen from over 150 submitted abstracts. Other work will be presented as posters. Jaya Satagopan, in collaboration with Sara Olson and Robert C. Elston (Case Western Reserve University), will be presenting their poster titled "Evaluation of Statistical Interactions for Binary Disease Traits."
